From the vicar, Richard Hare

As you read this, I'm guessing you're in the throes of tidying away Christmas decorations for another year. We tend to leave ours until quite near Twelfth Night, 6th January, but then they don't go up all that early – partly so as not to interfere with Advent, and partly because it's hard finding time in December in the vicarage to do it! A lot of people put up their decorations quite early in November, so they're quite happy to take them down early too. (We once had a neighbour who used to have a bonfire at 10 o'clock on Christmas morning to burn up all the wrapping paper, which we thought was quite sad). In many churches there's a tradition of keeping the crib on display right until Candlemas, 2 February, a full 40 days from Christmas. That's the day Jesus was presented in the Temple, at just under six weeks old, and marks the official end of the Christmas and Epiphany season.

Do you burn your rubbish, recycle it, throw it in the bin or all three? I hope you check through the wrapping paper to make sure there aren't any small presents left in the mess. We're pretty careful these days after a sad accident with a fridge magnet, an enthusiastic tidy-upper in the family, and a very upset small child! But there is something quite satisfying, isn't there, about getting the house clean and tidy again, ready for whatever the new year brings – some respite from this wretched virus would be welcome, wouldn't it?

Jesus was born, not to remain a cute baby in a stable, but to grow up... and to die – to take the rubbish of the world on his shoulders on the cross and cart it away, leaving us clean and new, bringing healing and forgiveness in the process. Please don't leave him in the wrappings, accidentally disposed of.
