Cricketers were “Run Out” by a Bull – Temporarily

In the Army, we are told, the old fashioned “bull” is on its way out, but there is still bull to be found in the cricket grounds of the Bridlington and District League – not the spit-and-polish variety, but the real thing, a-stampin’ and a-snortin’.

Trinity United and Barmston players beat a retreat on Saturday when a bull became too keen a follower of their cricketing prowess. As the bull scattered the wickets with its head the players were definitely run out – off the field.

A combined operation with no other secret weapon than stumps resulted in the defeat of the enemy, who retreated in disorder, no longer in command of the field.

Whether or not the war-time veterans of Trinity United were upset by this reintroduction of bull to their activities the fact remains that the fixture brought Trinity their first league defeat of the season while Barmston enjoyed their first league win.

There have been about a dozen people each time for a couple of months now, which is great. What's more, at our annual meeting in mid-May three new people stepped up to become members of the Parochial Church Council. Archdeacon Andy has said he wants to see even more local involvement, with people from the village volunteering to be churchwardens, treasurer and secretary, contributing financially and raising funds. But it looks as though the Diocesan Mission and Pastoral committee might be prepared to give us another year to get there. If we're still at the same level then, they'll recommend closure. But if there are further signs of growth we might be able to escape it. There's no room for complacency, but neither are there grounds for despair just yet.

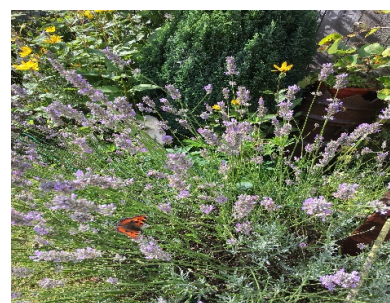
Sun 5th at 9.30 am – Holy Communion

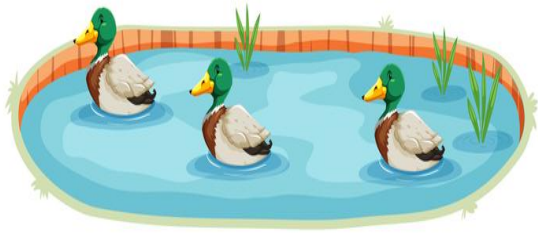
