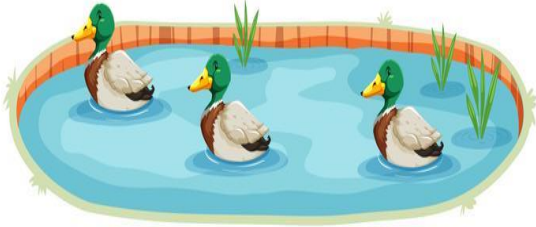

From the vicar, Richard Hare

A producer from BBC Look North rang me during Holy Week. Could they interview me in Barmston church on Good Friday about our possible closure? Yes of course, I said, but would they like to come with me afterwards to King Street in Bridlington, where all the town churches were gathering for our first open-air Good Friday service in three years?

So it was that I met Keith the cameraman and Amanda the reporter in church, and repeatedly lit and blew out candles until they had the right shot. TV doesn't lend itself to nuance, so it was a bit too 'old church building = bad, but open-air worship = good' for my liking, but they did their best. Particularly impressive was how they managed to edit together a piece in a little over an hour and zing it to the studio in time for the lunchtime news.



We've had quite a lot of interest on Twitter, national and local radio, press and TV since we've been talking about the sad possibility of closure. It was good to see a number of villagers at the open meeting on 4th April, and I think Archdeacon Andy Broom did a good job in making sure everyone had their say. He pointed out that, if the church were to remain open, it needed people to come along regularly and volunteer for the tasks that are needed to make it a living place of worship. He will make his recommendation to the Diocesan Mission and Pastoral Committee in June, but I would love to be able to tell him before then that people have stepped up to

the challenge. We've continued with low numbers at many services, but have seen over a dozen at a couple of Family Services, so there's still hope. The pain of Good Friday was necessary before the resurrection joys of Easter, after all...
